

out any longer. Come on in. You can have my room... my life."

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

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


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WHEN LIFE PUTS YOU DOWN

Except for the lucky few, everyone gets put down by life at one time or the other in our journey. Some, due to our poor choices and many due to forces and factors outside of our control. While we are prepared for some challenges, we are unprepared for most. Almost in all situations, we respond based on our upbringing, our experience, our training or knowledge, our maturity, faith orientation and access to a supporting network.

Therefore, when life puts you down:

1. Resolve to fight with every fibre of strength left in you. Making a decision not to surrender, quit and submit to fate is probably the most important step anyone can take in the valley. When we feel helpless, we feel hopeless and when we feel hopeless, we close every door of human and divine possibilities. I heard the story of a man who came to Canada many years ago and did everything he could to secure a job as an accountant but did not succeed. He then made plans to return to Pakistan where he came from. But he determined that he would do something unconventional in his push for a job before leaving. He approached an advertising agency to place an ad on his behalf for \$250 promoting his skills and experiences to potential employers. While he went to pay the agency the bill for his ad, the agency asked if he would help them do the reconciliation of their bank accounts which were in arrears while their accountant was on vacation. He gladly accepted the offer. Within few days, he completed the work excellently to the pleasant surprise of this ad agency and he was offered a job. Many years later, he became the majority shareholder of this company and grew it to one of the largest in the industry in Canada! Life has a way of yielding to those who are stubbornly determined to win and placed high demands on it.
2. Do a honest self-evaluation and make changes as needed in your attitudes, your ways, your choices, your associations; your value propositions, your decisions etc. Nothing works faster to lift us out of the valley than realizing where we went wrong, acknowledging it and making amends. Challenges are good life purifiers because they reveal our vulnerabilities, flaws and weaknesses. Becoming defensive and blaming others for our problems are effective traps on our way to restoration. Once we repent and make amends, we must forgive ourselves, quit the self condemnation walk and move on. Looking back incessantly prevents looking forward and hinders running a victorious race.
3. Pray, pray and pray. Prayer places the resources of heaven at our disposal. Apostle Paul urges us to pray all manners of prayers, to pray without ceasing, to seek prayer support from others and to pray both in our understanding and in the spirit. God brings ideas to our minds in prayers and gives us directions. He answers prayers and does miracles. It's important to learn and develop your spiritual hearing skills before trouble comes, otherwise you will be running from pillar to post hearing conflicting counsels from men that are not from the Lord. Learn to be discerning.
4. Take action - we should rise up in faith and obey the promptings in our hearts. Mourning, lamenting, complaining, crying or praying and remaining in one place will not work. For results, we must pray and work. Most times the action or step our minds contemplate may appear foolish and unreasonable, just do it.
5. Seek help - We are not built to walk alone and to shoulder the challenges of life all by ourselves. Therefore, access the supporting network of people and organizations around you. Personal ego and self-pride will attempt to discourage you from doing this but know that everyone has been helped and will be helped by someone else to reach their destiny in life. If you have helped others in need before in your life time, then getting help yourself when you are in need is nothing strange or demeaning. Jesus sought for support of his close disciples during his hour of trial. It is hard to predict who will help you, so avoid building high expectations of some and despising others. When you ask for help from someone and the person is not able to help, don't take it out on them since you have no idea what they are dealing with themselves at the time and they may be able to help in another season of your need. Move to the next person the Lord puts in your mind to go to. Note that the best support is not necessarily money or material but could be encouragement, advice, guidance, link with helpful people, strategic information, professional support, personal presence or just a listening ear.
6. Rejoice in hope and nourish your faith by feeding on inspiring messages, read the word of God, good books and listen to music filled with hope, confidence, worship and joy. You are what you eat so don't feed your heart with junk in the valley!
7. Be patient - God is not a late comer though it feels that way when we are in distress. His delays are not denials. He is faithful and can be trusted.

While in the valley or in the wilderness, let these words of Habakkuk be your guiding personal manifesto:

“Even though the fig trees have no blossoms, and there are no grapes on the vines; even though the olive crop fails, and the fields lie empty and barren; even though the flocks die in the fields, and the cattle barns are empty, yet I will rejoice in the Lord! I will be joyful in the God of my salvation! The Sovereign Lord is my strength! He makes me as surefooted as a deer, able to tread upon the heights”.

The Gift Of Peace

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!" Luke 3:13-14

Over the past months, the world has experienced an unprecedented shockwave; a trial that has humbled nations, caused pain and distress, fear and discontent. There is hardly anyone that has not been directly or indirectly affected by the effect of the raging pandemic that has taken many lives, left many with serious health conditions, ravaged economies, caused uncertainties and the list goes on. Even now, the world is yet to return to normal with things rapidly spiralling out of control. It is in the midst of all the events unravelling that Christ is revealing Himself to us as the Prince of peace and gifting peace to as many that would reach out and receive it.

But first we must examine how relevant and comforting this revelation and message is to us, especially if we already know who Jesus is. It is one thing to know who Christ is but yet another to experience Him in the context of who He is, and the experience has to be personal to you and I. It's like when Jesus began to speak with His disciples and He asked them; **"Who do men say that I, the Son of Man, am?" (Matthew 16:13)**

In response, they came up with all manner of what people say about Him. Jesus listened to all that they said and asked them the question that was personal to them and required a honest response;

"But who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15)

Peter's response was from the heart; "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."(Matthew 16:16)

Like Peter, it is important that Christ be revealed to us and that we know Him as the Prince of peace in order to better grasp the significance of what He is able to gift to us. This after all is a time when the world is celebrating Christmas but Christ, for many that celebrate is not real or known to many. Yet, Jesus Christ is the fulfilment of the prophecy in the book of Isaiah:

For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of His government and peace there will be no end (Isaiah 9:6-7)

It is important to recognise that we cannot in any way claim or receive this peace without first knowing the Prince of peace. Which brings us to the nature of this peace. What is it about this peace that makes it stand out and what does it mean to us in times like this? Let's look at the words of Jesus Christ, the Prince of peace for better understanding.

Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid (John 14:27)

We have already established that Jesus is the Prince of peace. Now we also know that He wants us to have peace and from the passage above, we see Him gifting out peace to as many as would embrace it. But there is a marked difference between the peace He wills and does give out compared to that which the world gives and He was clear about this.

The peace that the world gives is ephemeral; it does not last. Also the peace is not all-encompassing, providing short relief in one area and leaving other areas unsatisfied and vulnerable. Even more notable is the fact that the person or whoever gives peace in this world is also not whole or complete in himself or herself. Such is also deficient of peace in many areas and also crave and seek for peace. But not so with the Prince of peace. He gives liberally and it is all-encompassing. He is also all-sufficient and abounding in grace and peace. His is the peace that money, status, fame and possessions cannot buy. It is a gift.

I believe we need more understanding of this peace and the Lord Jesus points us to the work of peace when He says, "Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." It is the peace that the natural minded person cannot understand because it defies logic. It is the peace that gives confidence of a better outcome in the midst of uncertainties and doubts. It is the peace that eliminates fear even in times of trouble.

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, even though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea; Though its waters roar and be troubled, though the mountains shake with its swelling (Psalm 46:1-3)

There was a time the disciples were in the boat with Jesus as they attempted to cross over to the other side of the lake (Luke 8:22-25). As the journey progressed, Jesus tired from an exhausting day went to sleep. No sooner had He slept that a strong tempest troubled the boat and the disciples, many of them seasoned fishermen became confounded and fearful. As the storm raged, their lives were threatened and they wondered how Jesus was not affected by the raging of the storm but rather slept on. In the end, they came to Him, woke Him up and cried to Him for help.

... Then He arose and rebuked the wind and the raging of the water. And they ceased, and there was a calm (Luke 8:24)


What this demonstrates is that peace does not mean the absence of storms and troubles. It simply means that even in those troublous and testing times, there is an assurance of peace to weather the storm and come out victorious. We can also see that Jesus was in the boat while the tempest raged. The fact that Jesus Christ is in the boat of your life does not mean there will be no tempest. But you can have the kind of peace that enabled Jesus to sleep and rest while the tempest raged. Note that He was not affected by the storm but still enjoyed His rest.

There is also the assurance that we can speak to the storm and peace will become still. This is the very reason why Jesus rebuked his disciples with these words; "Where is your faith?"

Yes, peace in Him requires the walk of faith. It was this experience of faith that gave the Psalmist confidence to honour God in times of trouble. It is by believing and trusting in Him for peace that His peace become abundant in us. We cannot come to this experience if we do not know Him, receive and appropriate His word, stand in faith and allow the Prince of peace fill our hearts with such tremendous peace that fulfills our every need.

This is the gift of God especially now that many plan to celebrate Christmas quietly and alone; a cautious step towards reducing the spread of the raging pandemic. May we however use the quiet and aloneness to reflect truly on Jesus Christ and the gift of peace which He plans to give to every man, woman, family and people.



As you are committed back to mother earth today in Ogbomosho.


We celebrate God, who has made your life so full and impactful.
