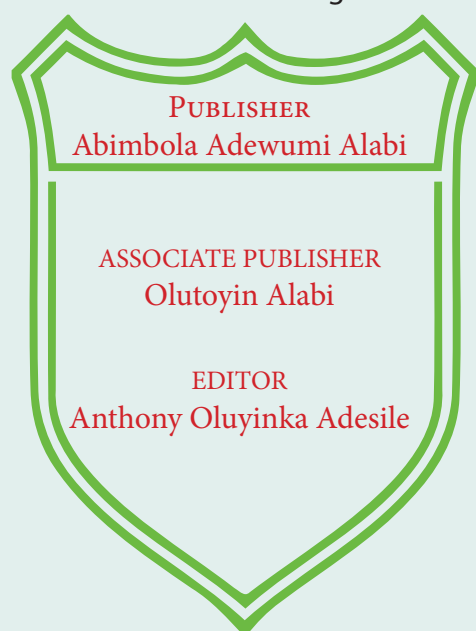

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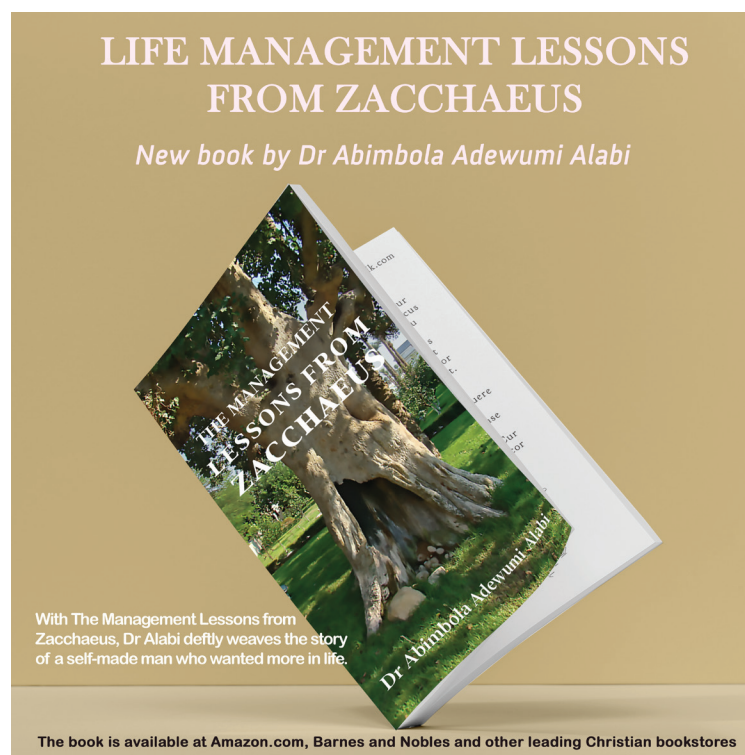

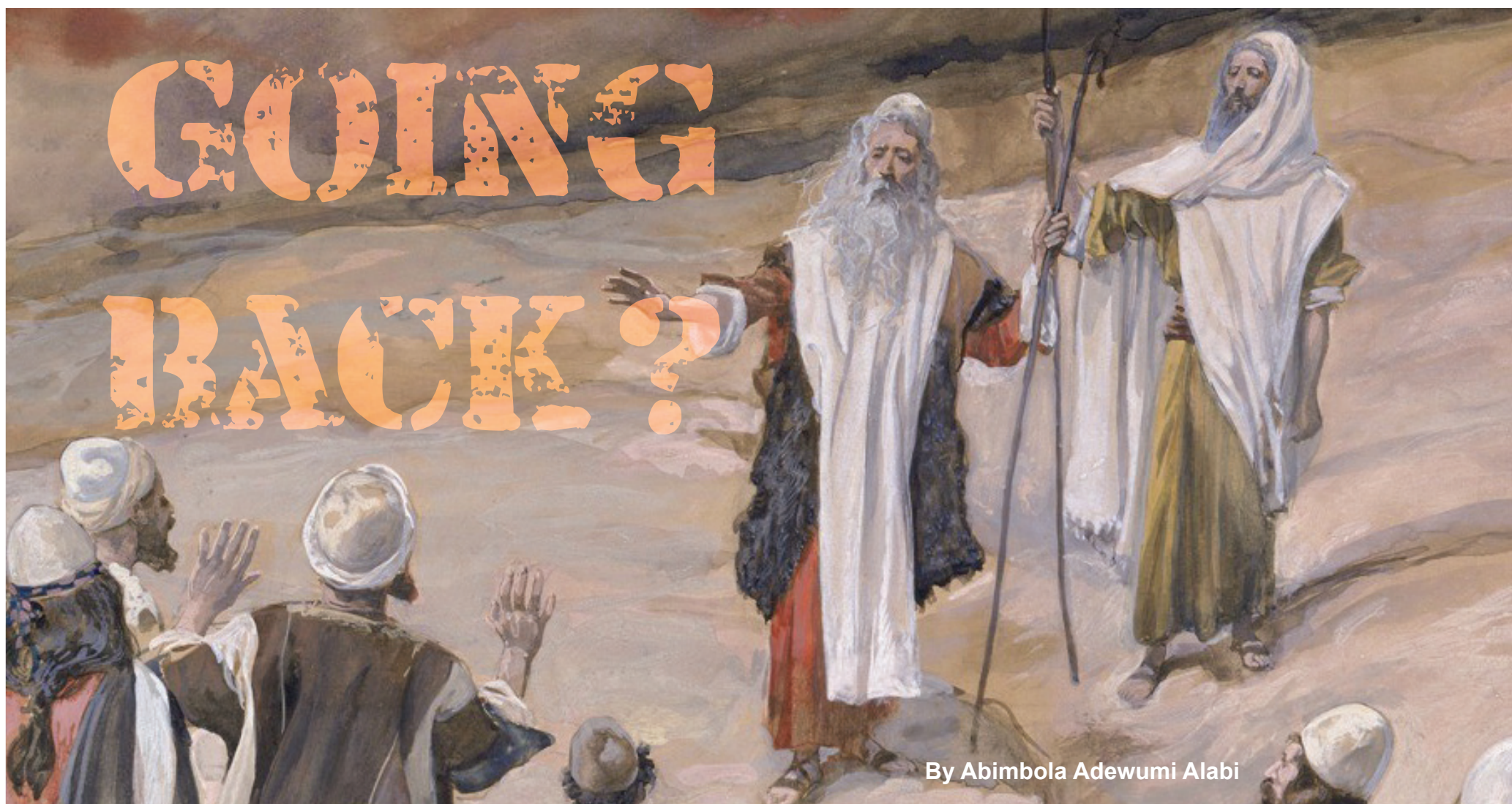

He Never Fails.

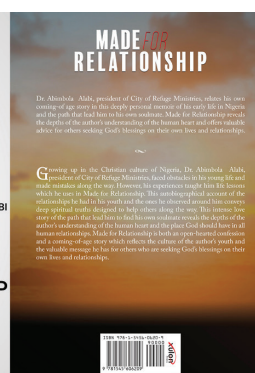
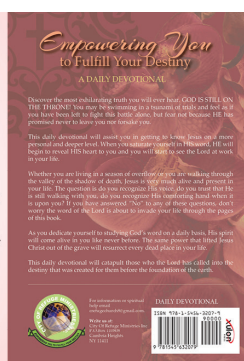
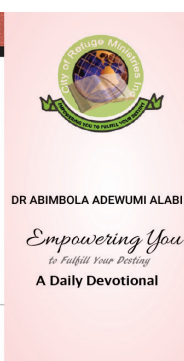
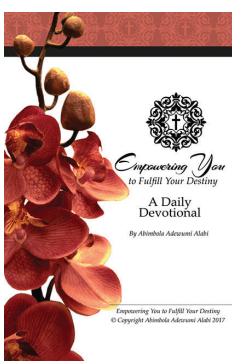

This Foundation Lecture is in memory of our Beloved Pastor Yomi Adewale who along with his esteemed wife began the Cornerstone Ministries under the clear leading and guidance of The Holy Spirit. I am honored to have been invited to present this year's Foundation Lecture and grateful to God for the Enablement, to be here, howbeit virtually, to pay my respects.

I am also grateful to Cornerstone members here in Staten Island, as well as in India, Germany, and in England for heeding the Word of God in Galatians 6:1-10 by lightening the heavy load on the shoulders of our dear Pastor Bola by, each of you, doing what you can, by praying, playing your own part where you are appointed to, and by being good to one another in this family of believers.

The theme for this year's conference is *The Future of Education*. With the rate and speed of change in today's world, it is a hazard to try to figure out the future of education. To attempt to know what the future of education will be, we must first attempt to know what the future of Man is. Indeed, perhaps our topic today might be to analyze the state of things in the world and from there make a prediction of that which ought to be the topic of today: Yes, *The Future of Man!*

The Future Of Man

Yes, how much future does Man have before Armageddon? Already the powers that be on earth have manufactured big bombs. One of those manufactured by Russia is called *Tsar Bomba* which means in English King of bombs. One by America is called Gravity Bomb. People of God are praying that the Russia/Ukraine war does not develop into a third world war. What is the future of Man if there is a third world war?

There has been a very rapid change in the world since the beginning of Coronavirus. When we look a little back, we will notice that the world has turned quite different from what it was at the beginning of this apparently unending Coronavirus pandemic, which started nearly three years ago and still counting....

Then there are the other parallel and destructive pandemics of storms, fires, and the rise of wicked autocratic regimes all over the world: North Korea, China, Syria, Myanmar, Iran, Sudan, Ethiopia, and Nigeria. The common feature of these regimes is that the governments take pleasure in killing their own citizens who do not conform or conform quickly enough. In the case of Nigeria, the government is quite disingenuous in its method. It opened her borders to let in foreigners to carry out the dirty job to the extent that Nigeria has become one of the worst places to live on earth.

Another trend in today's world is that freedom is under siege in the Western world and even in America once the bastion of freedom and democracy. Nonetheless, to reason together about Education and its future we need to try to agree first on some definition of Education. Is there a difference between Education and Training?

Education and Training

There is agreement in the intellectual world, that *Training* is about skill acquisition for specific jobs. The term "*Training and Development*" of an employee describes the capacity training of an employee regarding the set skills required by the employee to accomplish training goals that makes him do his or her work better. It is learning on a specific issue, such as 'heat and air-condition technology'

On the other hand, Education is about knowledge and the development of the intellect which is an education of the Mind an education that is intended to produce civilized men and women living at peace with one another, of which the latter goal appears rather elusive. Education is the path to knowledge that will make the learners develop their full potential and become successful.

Okay, let us take that definition as a working definition. One major focus of that definition is that the educated man seeks to live at peace with his neighbor and to advance the course of freedom, a major plank for societal peace. Obviously, from the observations shared earlier to which we are all witnesses, we need to know what is missing in the educational process that has made the expected outcome freedom and peace rather elusive. That brings us to the topic of today's discourse.

EDUCATION IS ABOUT LEARNING; BUT WHICH KNOWLEDGE IS WORTH MOST HAVING?

If we can come to the Truth of what is most worth knowing, then that which is most worth knowing is the knowledge that we must have for man to attain the purpose of Education. It must be what we would want our children to have; the knowledge that we would want our Teachers, our Pastors and our leaders in Church and state to have. And that is the knowledge we ourselves will want to pursue and have. The problem is this that even if there is such a subject or body of knowledge that is of the most worth how may we know it? It was once reported that C. P. Snow and F. R. Leavis an English literary critic, once exchanged blows disputing which knowledge was more important than the other: the knowledge of Shakespeare or the knowledge of thermodynamics in Physics.

I am sure most of us have been able to cope with life quite reasonably well, not knowing any of these two. In fact, for many in New York, learning is not beyond recognizing the *on and off* switch. In 1980, while in Columbia, I tried to join a volunteer group in a literacy drive. I was shocked to learn then that there were then over 50,000 in the city who could not read or write. There were many drivers, and I dare say, still are, who could not actually read the road signs. They follow the road signs.

Today about 3.9 million New Yorkers are functionally illiterate. 1 of 4 persons in California are illiterate. In fact, 21 percent of Americans are illiterate. On the other hand, in Cuba, literacy rate dropped from 99.80% in 1981 to 97.80% in 2002. So apparently the literacy rates do not reflect in level of peace and harmonious living together in these two nations or in the relationship of these nations leaders.

Education And Survival

But the issue is not about the knowledge a man needs to survive. It is not about how a man can survive in difficult situations. The issue has more to do "with what *man* not a man" must know for society to survive. In other words, what kind of knowledge do we need to have to ensure the survival of society as we know it.



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What knowledge is needed to prevent MAN's self-destruction? What kind of knowledge do we need to have to prevent us killing off one another? That would be some of the keyways to define the knowledge that is most worth having today. But where may we find it? What can an educator do to locate this kind of knowledge?

Some attempts have been made to answer this question. Some educators have advanced the notion that that kind of knowledge will evolve once the underpinning concept of our educational curriculum is that man needs to be educated for the *purpose of meeting society's needs*. The education of the most worth should be the one that *meets society's needs*. In this model, which follows the ant hill society, each person is educated to the highest level of his ability so he can efficiently serve the society. Everything is to the benefit of the 'ant' society. In this society, you do what you are told and for which you have been educated to the highest level!

This was the political model of the Communist Society. In that system, man is an expendable entity – the end justifies the means. Man in that concept exists to serve an amorphous body called 'Society', a term quite conveniently interchangeable with government. If the knowledge that is most worth having makes the individual only a means to an end, then the purpose of what is most worth knowing destroys man as he becomes a ready sacrifice to an idea.

No doubt, for Man to live the full life, as Aristotle has powerfully shown, Society is required. Man is a gregarious animal. But the other way round is palpably wrong... To put this crudely, in the ant hill model of educational purpose you do not ask moral questions. Individual moral position about what you are doing does not arise. But the truth is this Man is an end not a means to an end. Man has an intrinsic, very special kind of value. In order not to get into this trap, or to get out of this trap, which knowledge must we acquire that will make us retain our humanness, and as an end rather than a means to an end that is designed by others.

In Northern Korea, the purpose of man is to serve their President who is revered and worshipped as 'god'. He dictates who lives and who dies, and he is cheered as he does these evils. Anyone passing by his image stops to worship his image like that of Nebuchadnezzar. It is the law!

Even in America, the land of the Free, the followers of a former leader dedicated a home to him with a life-size photo of his in front of the shrine! His dedicated followers will do whatever he says without question.

There was a Pastor James Warren Jones, who on November 18, 1978, led hundreds of his followers in a mass murder-suicide at their agricultural commune in Guyana. The final death toll was 909. What kind of knowledge must Man have to eliminate such episodes of the slavery of the mind.

There was also the Pastor Lesego Daniel, who on January 10, 2014, commanded his congregation to get down and eat grass to be closer to God and then went on tamping on them. They obeyed.

The Great Books & Liberal Arts Schools

Over the years, the academic world has sought the answer in the Great Books. Liberal Arts schools have been established in the search for an education that liberates, an education that ensures that its beneficiaries are able to think by themselves.

The Example of St. Johns College: St. Johns College is a reputable Liberal Arts College that runs a unique liberal education curriculum based on the Great Books. Students are required to select from a list of the Great Books which students would study for 4 years. St John's University was established in 1870. The Great Books curriculum is made up of classic works in Philosophy, literature, political science. The Great Books Curriculum is still practiced today. If you google St John's College, you will find the following reading list from which to select for the current semester

Freshman Year of Study: Selections from:

Archimedes
Aristophanes
Aristotle
Herodotus
Plato
Etc.

The overall purpose of the Liberal arts colleges is to enable the student to develop his mind to be able to think independently, solve problems

and provide original solutions. Of course, products of St. John's college then go on to become doctors, engineers, once they have had this dose of Liberal Education.

The general purpose of university education is to liberate the mind, to be a problem solver and to make each person live at peace with his or her neighbor. Liberal education was designed to be education to prepare the beneficiaries for a free democratic society.

A successful product of this kind of liberal education may be found in Nigeria in Deacon Gamaliel Onasande who graduated in the Classics (Greek, Latin and Hebrew) and became a great Industrialist in Nigeria. Despite such great minds in Nigeria, the country is backward such that life today is brutish. It is virtually the same story all over Africa.

The Example of Harvard, the Oldest University in the US with Puritan Roots

Similarly, a Clergyman, a Puritan named John Harvard, founded Harvard in 1636. He endowed the college with 780 British pounds and his library of 320 volumes. The purpose of the University was to "to advance learning and perpetuate it to prosperity, dreading to leave an illiterate ministry to the churches when our present ministers shall lie in the dust." It is the oldest University in the US and easily the most prestigious University in the entire world. It is also the wealthiest University in the world. And it is most significant especially for the purpose of this paper that it was established to train Pastors for Church work. The first few Presidents of the University were clergymen.

The founding curriculum at Harvard was Classics. The Language of Instruction was Latin, and the other subjects were Greek and Hebrew. Other subjects included Rhetoric and Logic, Ethics and Politics, Arithmetic and geometry, metaphysics, and Theology. So, Harvard was a Liberal College par excellence designed to educate the mind as a clergy. Harvard was established to produce clergymen and gentlemen. Women were not initially admitted. Harvard normally issued license to preach to accredited preachers.

Naturally Harvard exerted a steadying hand on the morals of the society and the integrity of office holders. By law Harvard must retain an office of Chaplain. In regard to the Founding philosophy of Harvard, it is most dumbfounding that the current Chief Chaplain of Harvard University is an atheist, a 44-year-old Greg Epstein. He is the author of "Good without God, what a billion nonreligious people believe".

The story of Harvard is the story of the demise of the knowledge that was at least worth having even if not the most worth having that underpinned society that was stable and reasonably morally strong. And we can see the confusion that ensues when that kind of knowledge becomes lacking. That knowledge promoted the common good within the understanding of an institution and a society that believed in God.

Harvard is still training society's leaders, but the society has become a reflection of the culture that produced the chief chaplain who says there is no God. And if there is no God, then everyone becomes his or her own god.

There is a parallel history of the people of God summarized in Judges 21:25 "In those days, there was no King in Israel, everyone did that which was right in his own eyes." That seems to be like this time, when everybody wants to be his or her own King, his or her own 'god'. And we need again to seek to reinstate and reinforce in the minds of learners the knowledge that is of the most worth having.

The central Truth in the knowledge that is the most worth having is that it is not limited to a coterie of intellectuals. It is very egalitarian and so it is all empowering.

The qualification of the teacher comes from close and deep association with the Master, who is The Teacher. The Teacher called the learners (the disciples) so "that they might be with him" to learn from Him by being with Him, to learn by observing Him and following Him, following His Footsteps. Then when He knows that the learner is ready, He sends him or her out to teach others and bring them into the fold. Mark 3:14

Everybody is admissible into this educational process. It is an open enrolment policy and there is no tuition. It is free.

Where Then Shall We Find This Knowledge That Liberates?

The world scene is very troubled right now. There is war going on all over the world right now only not full scale but in skirmishes. There is no place where there is peace right now. Racial hatred is on the rise, apparently in

fulfillment of prophecy: “nation shall be against nation” Matthew 24:7. In this nation, America, the land of the free, there is mass shooting in one part of the country or the other virtually every day. And there is so much corruption everywhere even in the Justice system.

Where then shall we find this knowledge? It has to be the knowledge that will be easily available to all, the knowledge that will unite people and nations to live together in peace and unity. Otherwise, Man may perish from self-destruction.

There was a man who bemoaned that his nation was perishing for the lack of this knowledge. Prophet Hosea in Hosea 4:5 moans “My people perish for lack of Knowledge”. And that is the concern we are discussing here now. There is a whole lot of unnecessary ‘perishing’ going on in the world around us today.

In America, children are shooting children, parents kill their children, even their babies. In Nigeria. Babies are being hawked. If you think 2 Kings 6:29, (where 2 women agreed to cook their sons and eat), is exaggeration, read the news about what is happening to children in Nigeria and America today.

The African youths continue to perish as they run in desperation to flee hunger, joblessness, government assisted terrorism, and hopelessness and wicked leaders all over Africa. In America, the youth is under the tyranny of drugs and the so-called minorities among them targeted by law enforcement.

Hosea says it is all because of lack of knowledge and I must say he must be referring to the subject matter of today the lack of the knowledge that is most worth having. The knowledge that is available to the academic scholars as well as the illiterate driver.

Which knowledge?

The knowledge of the Truth.

Which Truth?

The Word of God.

You might be saying, but we are Christians, and we are now fast becoming a minority in this country and in Europe. Even if we have access to this critical knowledge how can we make it work for a nation, let alone the whole world?

Once upon a time there was a group of 12. They were a mixed grill of young people. Their leader was an illiterate fisherman called Peter. They possessed the knowledge, they knew the curriculum of instruction and these twelve were the teachers of the curriculum. They changed the world.

The world needs changing again now. Once we possess the knowledge and the curriculum of instruction contained in the Great Books, we can also change the world today.

There was an itinerant Professor of History who started it all, Professor John the Baptist. His school was located in the desert, yet it was oversubscribed. Senators, soldiers, as well as ordinary folks attended his class, the Beginners class for this knowledge. He it was who taught the old Great Books from which the New Great Books emerged.

Conclusion

What I have been trying to say for the past several minutes is this. At Christmas Jesus came to a broken world, a world full of wars and wickedness. He came after 400 years of silence when God did not speak through any prophet or directly to Man. He came because the world needed

change, needed transformation, and came down Himself and joined us in our mess to put things right.

Then He went back Home and left the 12, and through them us, in charge, to begin once again to “tend the garden” (Genesis 2:16), and this time, to occupy until He comes back. (Luke 19:13)

What knowledge then is most worth having?

The Knowledge of the Truth.

Which Truth?

The Word of God.

Where do we find this Word?

In the Great Books of The Bible. There are 66 of them. You never graduate from the course. It is a lifetime study experience, covering every subject, every topic, and every question that human mind can conceive.

And the icing on the cake is this. You do not have to be able to read and write to learn this TRUTH. You only must listen to hear This Truth. Faith comes by hearing. Romans 10:17

And what is more you do not have to have somebody read to you. God speaks to everyone on earth every day. Psalm 19:1-14

But how can this change the world? What about the Church? 140 years ago in 1882, there was a man Friedrich Nietzsche who gave a parable, *The Parable of the Madman!* On a sunny morning hour, he lit a lantern and ran to the marketplace crying incessantly “I seek God! I seek God” Many people there did not believe God and so laughed at him hysterically. Then the madman pierced into their eyes and exclaimed “where is God? We have killed him, you and I..... what after all are these churches now if they are not the tombs and sepulchers of God”

Needless to say, the chapel at Harvard now presided over by a man who says there is no God, is the “whited sepulcher” full of dead men’s bones that The Lord Jesus referred to in Matthew 23:21.

How can we change this? The same way The Teacher taught us to do: we transform the world one person at a time as we bring this knowledge OF THE TRUTH to the attention of somebody every day. It is a curriculum that can never fail. Get enrolled. Thank you all and now shall we pray.
